

INTRODUCTION

The OSHA 1910-120 Standard was promulgated in response to a requirement of the Superfund Amendments and Reauthorization Act (SARA) of 1986. The Standard, also known as "HAZWOPER", also applies to all hazardous waste operations.

- ♦ Government-required clean-up operations at hazardous waste sites
- ♦ RCRA Correction Action sites
- ♦ Voluntary clean-up at uncontrolled hazardous waste sites
- ♦ Operations at RCRA Treatment, Storage and Disposal Facilities (TSDF)
- ♦ Emergency Response Operations involving hazardous substances

As the foundation for HAZWOPER certification, OSHA requires attendance at a 40-hour course (or equivalent professional experience).

In response to the requests of our continuing education students, the Rocky Mountain Center for Occupational and Environmental Health (RMCOEH) is now offering a 40-hour 1910.120 course for the Intermountain Region. It meets the requirements for site workers, TSDF workers, and emergency response workers as specified in 29 CFR 1910.120(e), (p) and (q). This course will be conducted by well experience and credentialed RMCOEH faculty at cost-competitive pricing.

RMCOEH'S HAZWOPER TRAINERS

Our 40-hour HAZWOPER course will be instructed by individuals with over ten years each of experience in the fields of hazardous waste cleanup, site safety and health plans, exposure monitoring, personal protective equipment, and OSHA and EPA regulatory compliance. Several of our instructors are Certified Industrial Hygienists (CIH's) with Intermountain West experience in hazardous waste site identification, investigation and cleanup. These individuals have also been involved in EPA emergency cleanup operations throughout the Intermountain West.

RMCOEH HAZWOPER TRAINING COMPONENTS

Our standard course content will include the following OSHA-required components:

- ♦ Common hazardous waste site hazards
- ♦ Use of personal protective equipment
- ♦ Work practices to minimize risks, including engineering controls
- ♦ Medical surveillance and exposure monitoring
- ♦ Review of site safety and health plans

Examples of specific training topics may include, but not be limited to, the following:

- ♦ Specific construction safety standards
- ♦ Focused discussions/review on recent local emergency response actions
- ♦ Case studies of local hazardous waste site cleanup operations
- ♦ Exposure to specific chemical compounds
- ♦ Updates and reviews of new relevant OSHA standards

Tuition for the 40-hour HAZWOPER course is \$695. Tuition includes all necessary course materials, coffee breaks, course credit, and a \$50 non-refundable cancellation fee.

TUITION ASSISTANCE

Under federal subsidy, fee waivers are available for state and local government officials involved in hazardous waste remediation. Any state or local public servant interested in tuition support should make complete the application included in this brochure. PLEASE NOTE: You must provide documentation that you are employed by state or local government agencies.

DATES AND LOCATION
