

OVERVIEW

This course is intended to meet requirements established by EPA and other regulatory agencies for lead abatement supervisors and contractors. Abatement monitors, home improvement & remodeling contractors, environmental officers, occupational safety & health officers and others who desire a broad overview of lead abatement may also benefit from this course.

The course includes practical training exercises & job-site simulations conducted in an on-campus training facility. These exercises allow participants to practice the knowledge & skills that they have gained in the classroom in a realistic setting.

CREDIT

The Lead Supervisor/Contractor Training Course will be awarded Continuing Education Units (CEU's), the national standard of recognition for non-university professional education. 5.0 ABIH CM points have been awarded.

COURSE PREREQUISITES

EPA has not established prerequisites to take the course, but to become certified as a Supervisor you must have at least:

- one year experience as a certified lead-based paint abatement worker, or;
- two years experience in a related field (e.g., lead, asbestos, or environmental remediation work) or in the building trades.

NOTE: Individual state agencies may have more stringent requirements.

COURSE ACCREDITATION

This course is accredited by the State of Utah. It is also accredited by EPA only for purposes of certification under Subpart L, 745.226 of 40 CFR Part 745.

ENROLLMENT INFORMATION

Advance registration is required.
